**Matthew 5:38** "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth.' <sup>39</sup> "But I say to you, do not resist him who is evil; but whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn to him the other also.

<sup>40</sup> "And if anyone wants to sue you, and take your shirt, let him have your coat also.

<sup>41</sup> "And whoever shall force you to go one mile, go with him two.

<sup>42</sup> "Give to him who asks of you, and do not turn away from him who wants to borrow from you.

<sup>43</sup> "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor, and hate your enemy.'

<sup>44</sup> "But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you

<sup>45</sup> in order that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven; for He causes His sun to rise on *the* evil and *the* good, and sends rain on *the* righteous and *the* unrighteous.

<sup>46</sup> "For if you love those who love you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax-gatherers do the same?

<sup>47</sup> "And if you greet your brothers only, what do you do more *than others*? Do not even the Gentiles do the same?

<sup>48</sup> "Therefore you are to be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

**The Goal:** <sup>45</sup> "in order that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven"

## How, as God's children, do we respond to an evil person?

## #1 Do not go on the offensive.

#2 Value and help him.

#3 <u>Pray</u> for him.

### The Goal

Leviticus 19:1 Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying,

<sup>2</sup> "Speak to all the congregation of the sons of Israel and say to them, 'You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy.

**1 Peter 1:14** As obedient children, do not be conformed to the former lusts *which were yours* in your ignorance,

<sup>15</sup> but like the Holy One who called you, be holy yourselves also in all *your* behavior;

<sup>16</sup> because it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."

<sup>17</sup> And if you address as Father the One who impartially judges according to each man's work, conduct yourselves in fear during the time of your stay *upon earth*;

<sup>18</sup> knowing that you were not redeemed with perishable things like silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers,

<sup>19</sup> but with precious blood, as of a lamb unblemished and spotless, *the blood* of Christ.

**Hebrews 12:8** But if you are without discipline, of which all have become partakers, then you are illegitimate children and not sons.

<sup>9</sup> Furthermore, we had earthly fathers to discipline us, and we respected them; shall we not much rather be subject to the Father of spirits, and live?

<sup>10</sup> For they disciplined us for a short time as seemed best to them, but He *disciplines us* for *our* good, that we may share His holiness.

#### How, as God's children, do we respond to an evil person?

**Leviticus 19:17** 'You shall not hate your fellow countryman in your heart; you may surely reprove your neighbor, but shall not incur sin because of him.

<sup>18</sup> You shall not take vengeance, nor bear any grudge against the sons of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself; I am the LORD.

Leviticus 24:17 'And if a man takes the life of any human being, he shall surely be put to death.

<sup>18</sup> 'And the one who takes the life of an animal shall make it good, life for life.

<sup>19</sup> 'And if a man injures his neighbor, just as he has done, so it shall be done to him:

<sup>20</sup> fracture for fracture, eye for eye, tooth for tooth; just as he has injured a man, so it shall be inflicted on him.

<sup>21</sup> 'Thus the one who kills an animal shall make it good, but the one who kills a man shall be put to death.

<sup>22</sup> 'There shall be one standard for you; it shall be for the stranger as well as the native, for I am the LORD your God.'"

Romans 12:14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and curse not.

<sup>15</sup> Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.

<sup>16</sup> Be of the same mind toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation.

<sup>17</sup> Never pay back evil for evil to anyone. Respect what is right in the sight of all men.

<sup>18</sup> If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men.

<sup>19</sup> Never take your own revenge, beloved, but leave room for the wrath *of God*, for it is written, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay," says the Lord.

<sup>20</sup> "But if your enemy is hungry, feed him, and if he is thirsty, give him a drink; for in so doing you will heap burning coals upon his head."

<sup>21</sup> Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

**Romans 13:1** Let every person be in subjection to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God.

<sup>2</sup> Therefore he who resists authority has opposed the ordinance of God; and they who have opposed will receive condemnation upon themselves.

<sup>3</sup> For rulers are not a cause of fear for good behavior, but for evil. Do you want to have no fear of authority? Do what is good, and you will have praise from the same;

<sup>4</sup> for it is a minister of God to you for good. But if you do what is evil, be afraid; for it does not bear the sword for nothing; for it is a minister of God, an avenger who brings wrath upon the one who practices evil.

<sup>5</sup> Wherefore it is necessary to be in subjection, not only because of wrath, but also for conscience ' sake.

<sup>6</sup> For because of this you also pay taxes, for *rulers* are servants of God, devoting themselves to this very thing.

<sup>7</sup> Render to all what is due them: tax to whom tax *is due*; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor.

**1 Thessalonians 5:14** And we urge you, brethren, admonish the unruly, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with all men.

<sup>15</sup> See that no one repays another with evil for evil, but always seek after that which is good for one another and for all men.

**1 Peter 2:18** Servants, be submissive to your masters with all respect, not only to those who are good and gentle, but also to those who are unreasonable.

<sup>19</sup> For this *finds* favor, if for the sake of conscience toward God a man bears up under sorrows when suffering unjustly.

<sup>20</sup> For what credit is there if, when you sin and are harshly treated, you endure it with patience? But if when you do what is right and suffer *for it* you patiently endure it, this *finds* favor with God.

<sup>21</sup> For you have been called for this purpose, since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His steps,

<sup>22</sup> who committed no sin, nor was any deceit found in His mouth;

<sup>23</sup> and while being reviled, He did not revile in return; while suffering, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting *Himself* to Him who judges righteously;

<sup>24</sup> and He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed.

<sup>25</sup> For you were continually straying like sheep, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls.

**1 Peter 3:8** To sum up, let all be harmonious, sympathetic, brotherly, kindhearted, and humble in spirit; <sup>9</sup> not returning evil for evil, or insult for insult, but giving a blessing instead; for you were called for the very purpose that you might inherit a blessing.

<sup>10</sup> For, "Let him who means to love life and see good days Refrain his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking guile.

<sup>11</sup> "And let him turn away from evil and do good; Let him seek peace and pursue it.

<sup>12</sup> "For the eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, And His ears attend to their prayer, But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil."

<sup>13</sup> And who is there to harm you if you prove zealous for what is good?

<sup>14</sup> But even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, *you are* blessed. And do not fear their intimidation, and do not be troubled,

<sup>15</sup> but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always *being* ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence;

<sup>16</sup> and keep a good conscience so that in the thing in which you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame.

<sup>17</sup> For it is better, if God should will it so, that you suffer for doing what is right rather than for doing what is wrong.
