## How to Reach Rock Bottom

**Acts 5:40** And they took his advice; and after calling the apostles in, they flogged them and ordered them to speak no more in the name of Jesus, and *then* released them.

- <sup>41</sup> So they went on their way from the presence of the Council, rejoicing that they had been considered worthy to suffer shame for *His* name.
- <sup>42</sup> And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they kept right on teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ.
- **Acts 6:1** Now at this time while the disciples were increasing *in number*, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic *Jews* against the *native* Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving *of food*.
- <sup>2</sup> And the twelve summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables.
- <sup>3</sup> "But select from among you, brethren, seven men
- of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task.
- <sup>4</sup> "But we will devote ourselves to prayer, and to the ministry of the word."
- <sup>5</sup> And the statement found approval with the whole congregation; and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch.
- <sup>6</sup> And these they brought before the apostles; and after praying, they laid their hands on them.

## Ten observations exemplified in this passage:

- 1. A no excuse attitude of serving while suffering (5:40-6:1)
- 2. The care of widows (6:1)
- 3. Imperfection (6:1)
- 4. Leaders lead (6:2)
- 5. The organizing of leaders and teams so that no one is overlooked (6:3)
- 6. The practice of male leadership (6:3)
- 7. Requirements concerning reputation, spirituality and wisdom (6:3)
- 8. The freeing of leaders so that prayer and the ministry of the word is not neglected (6:4)
- 9. Congregational involvement in leadership identification (6:5)
- 10. Leadership involvement in leadership commissioning (6:6)

Corresponding to the big two observations in Acts 6 (#s 5&8) is 1 Timothy 3

## Three passages important to the context of 1 Timothy 3

- 1. 1 Timothy 1:1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus according to the commandment of God our Savior, and of Christ Jesus, *who is* our hope;
- <sup>2</sup> to Timothy, *my* true child in *the* faith: Grace, mercy *and* peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.
- <sup>3</sup> As I urged you upon my departure for Macedonia, remain on at Ephesus, in order that you may instruct certain men not to teach strange doctrines,
- <sup>4</sup> nor to pay attention to myths and endless genealogies, which give rise to mere speculation rather than *furthering* the administration of God which is by faith.
- <sup>5</sup> But the goal of our instruction is love from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.

- **2. 1 Timothy 1:12** I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because He considered me faithful, putting me into service;
- <sup>13</sup> even though I was formerly a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent aggressor. And yet I was shown mercy, because I acted ignorantly in unbelief;
- <sup>14</sup> and the grace of our Lord was more than abundant, with the faith and love which are *found* in Christ Jesus.
- <sup>15</sup> It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost *of all*.
- <sup>16</sup> And yet for this reason I found mercy, in order that in me as the foremost, Jesus Christ might demonstrate His perfect patience, as an example for those who would believe in Him for eternal life.
- **1 Timothy 2:8** Therefore I want the men in every place to pray, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and dissension.
- <sup>9</sup> Likewise, *I want* women to adorn themselves with proper clothing, modestly and discreetly, not with braided hair and gold or pearls or costly garments;
- <sup>10</sup> but rather by means of good works, as befits women making a claim to godliness.
- <sup>11</sup> Let a woman quietly receive instruction with entire submissiveness.
- <sup>12</sup> But I do not allow a woman to teach or exercise authority over a man, but to remain quiet.
- <sup>13</sup> For it was Adam who was first created, and then Eve.
- <sup>14</sup> And *it was* not Adam *who* was deceived, but the woman being quite deceived, fell into transgression.
- <sup>15</sup> But *women* shall be preserved through the bearing of children if they continue in faith and love and sanctity with self-restraint.
- **1 Timothy 3:1** It is a trustworthy statement: if any man aspires to the office of overseer, it is a fine work he desires *to do*.
- <sup>2</sup> An overseer, then, must be
  - above reproach,
  - the husband of one wife,
  - temperate,
  - prudent,
  - respectable,
  - hospitable,
  - able to teach.
  - 3not addicted to wine
  - or pugnacious,
  - but gentle,
  - uncontentious,
  - free from the love of money.
  - <sup>4</sup>He must be one who manages his own household well, keeping his children under control with all dignity
    - <sup>5</sup> (but if a man does not know how to manage his own household, how will he take care of the church of God?);
  - 6and not a new convert, lest he become conceited and fall into the condemnation incurred by the devil.
  - <sup>7</sup> And he must have a good reputation with those outside *the church*, so that he may not fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.

**Note:** poimenes, translated shepherds or pastors, presbuteroi, translated elders or presbyters and episkopoi, translated overseers or bishops are used interchangeably for the same position.

**Example:** 1 Peter 5:1 Therefore, I exhort the elders *presbuteroi* among you, as *your* fellow elder and witness of the sufferings of Christ, and a partaker also of the glory that is to be revealed,

- <sup>2</sup> shepherd *poimenes* the flock of God among you, exercising oversight *episkopoi* not under compulsion, but voluntarily, according to *the will of* God; and not for sordid gain, but with eagerness;
- <sup>3</sup> nor yet as lording it over those allotted to your charge, but proving to be examples to the flock.
- <sup>4</sup> And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory.

## 1 Timothy 3:8 Deacons likewise must be

- men of dignity,
- not double-tongued,
- or addicted to much wine
- or fond of sordid gain,
- 9but holding to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience.
- 10And let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons if they are beyond reproach.
- <sup>11</sup>Women *must* likewise *be*

dignified,

not malicious gossips,

but temperate,

faithful in all things.

- 12Let deacons be husbands of only one wife.
- and good managers of their children and their own households.

Observation: The qualifications are developed, unexceptional and are about character.

Why we need deacons and why every man needs to prayerfully consider becoming one:

- 1. So that we obey God's design (1 Timothy 3:8-15)
- 2. So that no one is overlooked (Acts 6)
- 3. So that prayer and the ministry of the word is not neglected (Acts 6)
