Some Excerpts from Life in Corinth

Acts 18:1 After these things he left Athens and went to Corinth.

- ² And he found a certain Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus, having recently come from Italy with his wife Priscilla, because Claudius had commanded all the Jews to leave Rome. He came to them,
- ³ and because he was of the same trade, he stayed with them and they were working; for by trade they were tent-makers.
- ⁴ And he was reasoning in the synagogue every Sabbath and trying to persuade Jews and Greeks.
- ⁵ But when Silas and Timothy came down from Macedonia, Paul *began* devoting himself completely to the word, solemnly testifying to the Jews that Jesus was the Christ.
- ⁶ And when they resisted and blasphemed, he shook out his garments and said to them, "Your blood *be* upon your own heads! I am clean. From now on I shall go to the Gentiles."
- ⁷ And he departed from there and went to the house of a certain man named Titius Justus, a worshiper of God, whose house was next to the synagogue.
- ⁸ And Crispus, the leader of the synagogue, believed in the Lord with all his household, and many of the Corinthians when they heard were believing and being baptized.
- ⁹ And the Lord said to Paul in the night by a vision, "Do not be afraid *any longer*, but go on speaking and do not be silent;
- ¹⁰ for I am with you, and no man will attack you in order to harm you, for I have many people in this city."
- ¹¹ And he settled *there* a year and six months, teaching the word of God among them...

And they said, "Into John's baptism." ⁴ And Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in Him who was coming after him, that is, in Jesus."

Acts 20:17 And from Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called to him the elders of the church.

- ¹⁸ And when they had come to him, he said to them, "You yourselves know, from the first day that I set foot in Asia, how I was with you the whole time,
- ¹⁹ serving the Lord with all humility and with tears and with trials which came upon me through the plots of the Jews:
- ²⁰ how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you publicly and from house to house,
- ²¹ solemnly testifying to both Jews and Greeks of repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Acts 20:31 "Therefore be on the alert, remembering that night and day for a period of three years I did not cease to admonish each one with tears.

- ³² "And now I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build *you* up and to give *you* the inheritance among all those who are sanctified.
- ³³ "I have coveted no one's silver or gold or clothes.
- ³⁴ "You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my *own* needs and to the men who were with me.
- ³⁵ "In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive."
- ³⁶ And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all.
- ³⁷ And they *began* to weep aloud and embraced Paul, and repeatedly kissed him,
- ³⁸ grieving especially over the word which he had spoken, that they should see his face no more. And they were accompanying him to the ship.
