
## Divinity, Masculinity and Femininity



9/18/16

- **1 Corinthians 11:1** Be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ.
- <sup>2</sup> Now I praise you because you remember me in everything, and hold firmly to the traditions, just as I delivered them to you.

#### The Big Idea

- <sup>3</sup> But I want you to understand that
- 1. Christ is the head of every man,

and

2. the man is the head of a woman,

and

3. God is the head of Christ.

### The Application

- 1. <sup>4</sup> Every man who has *something* on his head while praying or prophesying, disgraces his head.
- <sup>5</sup> But
- 2. every woman who has her head uncovered while praying or prophesying, disgraces her head;

### The Explanation

- 1. for she is one and the same with her whose head is shaved.
- **2.** <sup>6</sup> For if a woman does not cover her head, let her also have her hair cut off; but if it is disgraceful for a woman to have her hair cut off or her head shaved, let her cover her head.
- **3.** <sup>7</sup> For a man ought not to have his head covered, since he is the image and glory of God; but the woman is the glory of man.
- **4.** <sup>8</sup> For man does not originate from woman, but woman from man;
- **5**. 9 for indeed man was not created for the woman's sake, but woman for the man's sake.

- **6.** <sup>10</sup> Therefore the woman ought to have *a symbol of* authority on her head, because of the angels.
- <sup>11</sup> However, in the Lord, neither is woman independent of man, nor is man independent of woman.
- <sup>12</sup> For as the woman originates from the man, so also the man *has his birth* through the woman; and all things originate from God.
- 7. <sup>13</sup> Judge for yourselves: is it proper for a woman to pray to God *with head* uncovered?
- <sup>14</sup> Does not even nature itself teach you that if a man has long hair, it is a dishonor to him,
- <sup>15</sup> but if a woman has long hair, it is a glory to her? For her hair is given to her for a covering.

# Divinity, Wealth and Poverty

### Wealth and Poverty

- **1 Corinthians 11:17** But in giving this instruction, I do not praise you, because you come together not for the better but for the worse.
- <sup>18</sup> For, in the first place, when you come together as a church, I hear that divisions exist among you; and in part, I believe it.
- <sup>19</sup> For there must also be factions among you, in order that those who are approved may have become evident among you.
- <sup>20</sup> Therefore when you meet together, it is not to eat the Lord's Supper,
- <sup>21</sup> for in your eating each one takes his own supper first; and one is hungry and another is drunk.
- <sup>22</sup> What! Do you not have houses in which to eat and drink? Or do you despise the church of God, and shame those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you? In this I will not praise you.

### The Big Idea: remember Jesus and proclaim His death

- <sup>23</sup> For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus in the night in which He was betrayed took bread;
- <sup>24</sup> and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, "This is My body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of Me."
- <sup>25</sup> In the same way *He took* the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood; do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
- <sup>26</sup> For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>16</sup> But if one is inclined to be contentious, we have no other practice, nor have the churches of God.

### The Application (the how to)

- 1. <sup>27</sup> Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner, shall be guilty of the body and the blood of the Lord.
- <sup>28</sup> But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup.
- <sup>29</sup> For he who eats and drinks, eats and drinks judgment to himself, if he does not judge the body rightly.
- <sup>30</sup> For this reason many among you are weak and sick, and a number sleep.
- <sup>31</sup> But if we judged ourselves rightly, we should not be judged.
- <sup>32</sup> But when we are judged, we are disciplined by the Lord in order that we may not be condemned along with the world.
- 2. <sup>33</sup> So then, my brethren, when you come together to eat, wait for one another.
- <sup>34</sup> If anyone is hungry, let him eat at home, so that you may not come together for judgment. And the remaining matters I shall arrange when I come.
