Together, we must be people who are...

## I. Servants

**Titus 1:1** Paul, a bond-servant of God, and an apostle of Jesus Christ, for the faith of those chosen of God and the knowledge of the truth which is according to godliness,

- <sup>2</sup> in the hope of eternal life, which God, who cannot lie, promised long ages ago,
- <sup>3</sup> but at the proper time manifested, *even* His word, in the proclamation with which I was entrusted according to the commandment of God our Savior;
- <sup>4</sup> to Titus, my true child in a common faith: Grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Savior.

# II. Qualified

<sup>5</sup> For this reason I left you in Crete, that you might set in order what remains, and appoint elders in every city as I directed you,

<sup>6</sup> namely, if any man be

above reproach,

the husband of one wife,

having children who believe,

not accused of dissipation or rebellion.

<sup>7</sup> For the overseer must be above reproach as God's steward,

not self-willed.

not quick-tempered,

not addicted to wine,

not pugnacious,

not fond of sordid gain,

8but hospitable,

loving what is good,

sensible,

just,

devout,

self-controlled.

<sup>9</sup>holding fast the faithful word which is in accordance with the teaching, that he may be able both to exhort in sound doctrine and to refute those who contradict.

#### III. Protectors

- <sup>10</sup> For there are many rebellious men, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision,
- <sup>11</sup> who must be silenced because they are upsetting whole families, teaching things they should not *teach*, for the sake of sordid gain.
- <sup>12</sup> One of themselves, a prophet of their own, said, "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons."
- <sup>13</sup> This testimony is true. For this cause reprove them severely that they may be sound in the faith,
- <sup>14</sup> not paying attention to Jewish myths and commandments of men who turn away from the truth.
- <sup>15</sup> To the pure, all things are pure; but to those who are defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure, but both their mind and their conscience are defiled.

<sup>16</sup> They profess to know God, but by *their* deeds they deny *Him*, being detestable and disobedient, and worthless for any good deed.

# IV. Authoritative (see 2:15) Men who hold these convictions:

2:1 But as for you, speak the things which are fitting for sound doctrine.

#### A 2Older men are to be

- 1. temperate,
- 2. dignified,
- 3. sensible,
- 4. sound in faith,
- **5**. (sound) in love,
- **6.** (sound) in perseverance.

#### **B** <sup>3</sup>Older women likewise are to be

- 1. reverent in their behavior,
- 2. not malicious gossips,
- 3. nor enslaved to much wine,
- 4. teaching what is good,

## **C** 4that they may encourage the **young women**

- 1. to love their husbands,
- 2. to love their children,
- 3. 5to be sensible,
- **4**. (to be) pure,
- **5**. (to be) workers at home,
- **6**. (to be) kind,
- **7**. being subject to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be dishonored.

#### **D** <sup>6</sup>Likewise urge the **young men** to be sensible;

## **E** <sup>7</sup>in all things show **yourself** to be

- 1. an example of good deeds,
- 2. with purity in doctrine,
- 3. dignified,
- 4. 8 sound in speech which is beyond reproach,

in order that the opponent may be put to shame, having nothing bad to say about us.

#### F <sup>9</sup>*Urge* bondslaves

- 1. to be subject to their own masters in everything,
- 2. to be well-pleasing,
- **3**. not argumentative,
- 4. <sup>10</sup>not pilfering,
- 5. but showing all good faith

that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in every respect.

- <sup>11</sup> For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men,
- <sup>12</sup> instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age,
- <sup>13</sup> looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus;
- <sup>14</sup> who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds.
- <sup>15</sup> These things speak and exhort and reprove with all authority. Let no one disregard you.

#### **G** 3:1 Remind them

- 1. to be subject to rulers, to authorities, to be obedient,
- 2. to be ready for every good deed,
- 3. <sup>2</sup>to malign no one,
- **4**. to be uncontentious,
- 5. gentle,
- **6**. showing every consideration for all men.
- <sup>3</sup> For we also once were foolish ourselves, disobedient, deceived, enslaved to various lusts and pleasures, spending our life in malice and envy, hateful, hating one another.
- <sup>4</sup> But when the kindness of God our Savior and *His* love for mankind appeared,
- <sup>5</sup> He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit,
- <sup>6</sup> whom He poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior,
- <sup>7</sup> that being justified by His grace we might be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.
- <sup>8</sup> This is a trustworthy statement; and concerning these things I want you to speak confidently, so that those who have believed God may be careful to engage in good deeds. These things are good and profitable for men.
- <sup>9</sup> But shun foolish controversies and genealogies and strife and disputes about the Law; for they are unprofitable and worthless.
- <sup>10</sup> Reject a factious man after a first and second warning.
- <sup>11</sup> knowing that such a man is perverted and is sinning, being self-condemned.
- <sup>12</sup> When I send Artemas or Tychicus to you, make every effort to come to me at Nicopolis, for I have decided to spend the winter there.
- <sup>13</sup> Diligently help Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their way so that nothing is lacking for them.
- <sup>14</sup> And let our *people* also learn to engage in good deeds to meet pressing needs, that they may not be unfruitful.
- <sup>15</sup> All who are with me greet you. Greet those who love us in *the* faith. Grace be with you all.
