## 2 Corinthians 10

- 1. we think about Jesus' example of meekness and gentleness 2 Corinthians 10:1 Now I, Paul, myself urge you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ— 2. we are aware we are slandered I who am meek when face to face with you, but bold toward you when absent! 3. we know we need to c waywardness, but we don't want to <sup>2</sup> I ask that when I am present I may not be bold with the confidence with which I propose to be courageous against some, who regard us as if we walked according to the flesh. 4. we focus on destroying unbiblical t using divine weapons <sup>3</sup> For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, <sup>4</sup> for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses. <sup>5</sup> We are destroying speculations and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ, <sup>6</sup> and we are ready to punish all disobedience, whenever your obedience is complete. 5. we rest in our identity and authority in C\_\_\_\_\_
- <sup>7</sup> You are looking at things as they are outwardly. If anyone is confident in himself that he is Christ's, let him consider this again within himself, that just as he is Christ's, so also are we.
- <sup>8</sup> For even if I should boast somewhat further about our authority, which the Lord gave for building you up and not for destroying you, I shall not be put to shame,
- <sup>9</sup> for I do not wish to seem as if I would terrify you by my letters.

To they say, This letters are weighty and strong, but his personal presence is drinnipressive, and his
speech contemptible."
<sup>11</sup> Let such a person consider this, that what we are in word by letters when absent, such persons we
are also in deed when present.
6. we avoid c
<sup>12</sup> For we are not bold to class or compare ourselves with some of those who commend themselves; but
when they measure themselves by themselves, and compare themselves with themselves, they are
without understanding.
7. we appeal to our t and hope for respect
But we will not boast beyond <i>our</i> measure, but within the measure of the sphere which God
apportioned to us as a measure, to reach even as far as you.
<sup>14</sup> For we are not overextending ourselves, as if we did not reach to you, for we were the first to come
even as far as you in the gospel of Christ;
<sup>15</sup> not boasting beyond <i>our</i> measure, <i>that is</i> , in other men's labors, but with the hope that as your faith
grows, we shall be, within our sphere, enlarged even more by you,
<sup>16</sup> so as to preach the gospel even to the regions beyond you, <i>and</i> not to boast in what has been
accomplished in the sphere of another.
8. we know all credit goes to t
<sup>17</sup> But he who boasts, let him boast in the Lord.
9. we know G opinion matters most
<sup>18</sup> For not he who commends himself is approved, but whom the Lord commends.
10. our motive is the church's purity and devotion to C
2 Corinthians 11:1 I wish that you would bear with me in a little foolishness; but indeed you are bearing
with me.

<sup>2</sup> For I am jealous for you with a godly jealousy; for I betrothed you to one husband, that to Christ I might

present you as a pure virgin.

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$^{3}$ But I am afraid, lest as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, your minds should be led astray
from the simplicity and purity of devotion to Christ.
