What we really think about rebellion, lying and slander

2 Corinthians 10:1-11:15

10. our motive is each the church's purity and devotion to Christ

- **2 Corinthians 11:1** I wish that you would bear with me in a little foolishness; but indeed you are bearing with me.
- ² For I am jealous for you with a godly jealousy; for I betrothed you to one husband, that to Christ I might present you *as* a pure virgin.

11. our fear is that some may be lead astray from Christ

³ But I am afraid, lest as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, your minds should be led astray from the simplicity and purity *of devotion* to Christ.

12. our consternation is that we don't understand the church's lack of discernment

⁴ For if one comes and preaches another Jesus whom we have not preached, or you receive a different spirit which you have not received, or a different gospel which you have not accepted, you bear *this* beautifully.

13. we value knowledge over oratory

- ⁵ For I consider myself not in the least inferior to the most eminent apostles.
- ⁶ But even if I am unskilled in speech, yet I am not *so* in knowledge; in fact, in every way we have made *this* evident to you in all things.

14. we are aware some sacrifices will be taken the wrong way

- ⁷ Or did I commit a sin in humbling myself that you might be exalted, because I preached the gospel of God to you without charge?
- ⁸ I robbed other churches, taking wages *from them* to serve you;
- ⁹ and when I was present with you and was in need, I was not a burden to anyone; for when the brethren came from Macedonia, they fully supplied my need, and in everything I kept myself from being a burden to you, and will continue to do so.
- ¹⁰ As the truth of Christ is in me, this boasting of mine will not be stopped in the regions of Achaia.
- ¹¹ Why? Because I do not love you? God knows *I do*!

15. we try to protect the church from false teachers

- ¹² But what I am doing, I will continue to do, that I may cut off opportunity from those who desire an opportunity to be regarded just as we are in the matter about which they are boasting.
- ¹³ For such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ.

16. we are aware of satanic schemes

1. Boast about my L

- ¹⁴ And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.
- ¹⁵ Therefore it is not surprising if his servants also disguise themselves as servants of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their deeds.

How to Boast

2 Corinthians 11:16-12:13

2 Corinthians 10:17 But he who boasts, let him boast in the Lord.	
2. Boast about my w	

- **2 Corinthians 11:16** Again I say, let no one think me foolish; but if *you do*, receive me even as foolish, that I also may boast a little.
- ¹⁷ That which I am speaking, I am not speaking as the Lord would, but as in foolishness, in this confidence of boasting.
- ¹⁸ Since many boast according to the flesh, I will boast also.
- ¹⁹ For you, being *so* wise, bear with the foolish gladly.
- ²⁰ For you bear with anyone if he enslaves you, if he devours you, if he takes advantage of you, if he exalts himself, if he hits you in the face.
- ²¹ To *my* shame I *must* say that we have been weak *by comparison*. But in whatever respect anyone *else* is bold (I speak in foolishness), I am just as bold myself.
- ²² Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they descendants of Abraham? So am I.
- ²³ Are they servants of Christ? (I speak as if insane) I more so; in far more labors, in far more imprisonments, beaten times without number, often in danger of death.
- ²⁴ Five times I received from the Jews thirty-nine *lashes*.
- ²⁵ Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, a night and a day I have spent in the deep.
- ²⁶ *I have been* on frequent journeys, in dangers from rivers, dangers from robbers, dangers from *my* countrymen, dangers from the Gentiles, dangers in the city, dangers in the wilderness, dangers on the sea, dangers among false brethren;
- ²⁷ I have been in labor and hardship, through many sleepless nights, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure.
- ²⁸ Apart from *such* external things, there is the daily pressure upon me *of* concern for all the churches.
- ²⁹ Who is weak without my being weak? Who is led into sin without my intense concern?
- ³⁰ If I have to boast, I will boast of what pertains to my weakness.

- ³¹ The God and Father of the Lord Jesus, He who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying.
- ³² In Damascus the ethnarch under Aretas the king was guarding the city of the Damascenes in order to seize me.
- ³³ and I was let down in a basket through a window in the wall, and *so* escaped his hands.
- **12:1** Boasting is necessary, though it is not profitable; but I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord.
- ² I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago-- whether in the body I do not know, or out of the body I do not know, God knows-- such a man was caught up to the third heaven.
- ³ And I know how such a man-- whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, God knows--
- ⁴ was caught up into Paradise, and heard inexpressible words, which a man is not permitted to speak.
- ⁵ On behalf of such a man will I boast; but on my own behalf I will not boast, except in regard to *my* weaknesses.
- ⁶ For if I do wish to boast I shall not be foolish, for I shall be speaking the truth; but I refrain *from this*, so that no one may credit me with more than he sees *in* me or hears from me.
- ⁷ And because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, for this reason, to keep me from exalting myself, there was given me a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to buffet me-- to keep me from exalting myself!
- ⁸ Concerning this I entreated the Lord three times that it might depart from me.
- ⁹ And He has said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness." Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, that the power of Christ may dwell in me.
- ¹⁰ Therefore I am well content with weaknesses, with insults, with distresses, with persecutions, with difficulties, for Christ's sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong.
- ¹¹ I have become foolish; you yourselves compelled me. Actually I should have been commended by you, for in no respect was I inferior to the most eminent apostles, even though I am a nobody.
- ¹² The signs of a true apostle were performed among you with all perseverance, by signs and wonders and miracles.
- ¹³ For in what respect were you treated as inferior to the rest of the churches, except that I myself did not become a burden to you? Forgive me this wrong!
