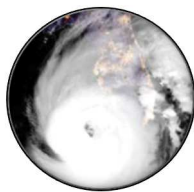
## Lunch Fellowship NEXT SUNDAY

emergency. (The Jones family is safe at home.) Sometimes texts get through when voice calls don't.

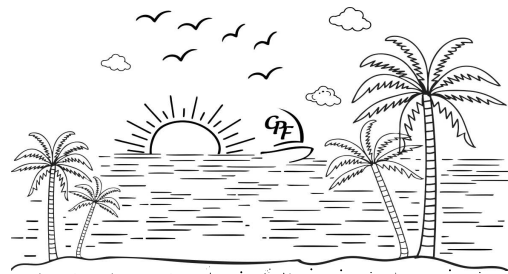
**You must opt-in** in order for us to send you messages from a "business" texting app (even if we have your cell number on file for individual use.) Texts will be short with time-sensitive information.

## That Guy... Seriously?

7/7/24

**1 Peter 1:1** Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who reside as aliens, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, who are chosen

**Luke 5:4-11** *Peter, James and John leave their fishing business and follow Jesus*

**Matthew 14:28** And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water."

<sup>29</sup> And He said, "Come!" And Peter got out of the boat, and walked on the water and came toward Jesus.

<sup>30</sup> But seeing the wind, he became afraid, and beginning to sink, he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!"

<sup>31</sup> And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and took hold of him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

<sup>32</sup> And when they got into the boat, the wind stopped.

<sup>33</sup> And those who were in the boat worshiped Him, saying, "You are certainly God's Son!"

**Matthew 16:15** He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"

<sup>16</sup> And Simon Peter answered and said, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God."

<sup>17</sup> And Jesus answered and said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon Barjona, because flesh and blood did not reveal *this* to you, but My Father who is in heaven.

<sup>18</sup> "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades shall not overpower it.

<sup>19</sup> "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

<sup>20</sup> Then He warned the disciples that they should tell no one that He was the Christ.

<sup>21</sup> From that time Jesus Christ began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised up on the third day.

<sup>22</sup> And Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "God forbid *it*, Lord! This shall never happen to You."

<sup>23</sup> But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's."

<sup>24</sup> Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me.

<sup>25</sup> "For whoever wishes to save his life shall lose it; but whoever loses his life for My sake shall find it.

**Luke 22:31** "Simon, Simon, behold, Satan has demanded *permission* to sift you like wheat;

<sup>32</sup> but I have prayed for you, that your faith may not fail; and you, when once you have turned again, strengthen your brothers."

<sup>33</sup> And he said to Him, "Lord, with You I am ready to go both to prison and to death!"

<sup>34</sup> And He said, "I say to you, Peter, the cock will not crow today until you have denied three times that you know Me."

**John 18:10** Simon Peter therefore having a sword, drew it, and struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear; and the slave's name was Malchus.

<sup>11</sup> Jesus therefore said to Peter, "Put the sword into the sheath; the cup which the Father has given Me, shall I not drink it?"

<sup>12</sup> So the *Roman* cohort and the commander, and the officers of the Jews, arrested Jesus and bound Him,

**John 21:15** So when they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Tend My lambs."

<sup>16</sup> He said to him again a second time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Shepherd My sheep."

<sup>17</sup> He said to him the third time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep.

<sup>18</sup> "Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to gird yourself, and walk wherever you wished; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will gird you, and bring you where you do not wish to *go*."

<sup>19</sup> Now this He said, signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when He had spoken this, He said to him, "Follow Me!"

<sup>20</sup> Peter, turning around, saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following *them*; the one who also had leaned back on His breast at the supper, and said, "Lord, who is the one who betrays You?"

<sup>21</sup> Peter therefore seeing him said to Jesus, "Lord, and what about this man?"

<sup>22</sup> Jesus said to him, "If I want him to remain until I come, what *is that* to you? You follow Me!"

**Acts 2:21** '...everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

<sup>22</sup> "Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know--

<sup>23</sup> this *Man*, delivered up by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put *Him* to death.

<sup>24</sup> "And God raised Him up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power.

...<sup>37</sup> Now when they heard *this*, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?"

<sup>38</sup> And Peter *said* to them, "Repent, and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

<sup>39</sup> "For the promise is for you and your children, and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God shall call to Himself."

<sup>40</sup> And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on exhorting them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation!"

<sup>41</sup> So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

<sup>42</sup> And they were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

**Acts 4:7** And when they had placed them in the center, they *began to* inquire, "By what power, or in what name, have you done this?"

<sup>8</sup> Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers and elders of the people,

<sup>9</sup> if we are on trial today for a benefit done to a sick man, as to how this man has been made well,

<sup>10</sup> let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead--by this *name* this man stands here before you in good health.

<sup>11</sup> "He is the stone which was rejected by you, the builders, *but* which became the very corner *stone*.

<sup>12</sup> "And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men, by which we must be saved."

<sup>13</sup> Now as they observed the confidence of Peter and John, and understood that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were marveling, and *began to* recognize them as having been with Jesus.

**Acts 5:40** And they took his advice; and after calling the apostles in, they flogged them and ordered them to speak no more in the name of Jesus, and *then* released them.

<sup>41</sup> So they went on their way from the presence of the Council, rejoicing that they had been considered worthy to suffer shame for *His* name.

<sup>42</sup> And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they kept right on teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ.

**Acts 11:1** Now the apostles and the brethren who were throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God.

<sup>2</sup> And when Peter came up to Jerusalem, those who were circumcised took issue with him,

<sup>3</sup> saying, "You went to uncircumcised men and ate with them."

<sup>4</sup> But Peter began *speaking* and *proceeded* to explain to them in orderly sequence, saying,

**Galatians 2:11** But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned.

<sup>12</sup> For prior to the coming of certain men from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, he *began* to withdraw and hold himself aloof, fearing the party of the circumcision.

<sup>13</sup> And the rest of the Jews joined him in hypocrisy, with the result that even Barnabas was carried away by their hypocrisy.

**Acts 12:1** Now about that time Herod the king laid hands on some who belonged to the church, in order to mistreat them.

<sup>2</sup> And he had James the brother of John put to death with a sword.

<sup>3</sup> And when he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. Now it was during the days of Unleavened Bread.

<sup>4</sup> And when he had seized him, he put him in prison, delivering him to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending after the Passover to bring him out before the people.

<sup>5</sup> So Peter was kept in the prison, but prayer for him was being made fervently by the church to God.

<sup>6</sup> And on the very night when Herod was about to bring him forward, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains; and guards in front of the door were watching over the prison.
