



## That Guy... Seriously?

**1 Peter 1:1** Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who reside as aliens, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, who are chosen

**Luke 22:31** "Simon, Simon, behold, Satan has demanded *permission* to sift you like wheat;

<sup>32</sup> but I have prayed for you, that your faith may not fail; and you, when once you have turned again, strengthen your brothers."

<sup>33</sup> And he said to Him, "Lord, with You I am ready to go both to prison and to death!"

<sup>34</sup> And He said, "I say to you, Peter, the cock will not crow today until you have denied three times that you know Me."

**John 18:10** Simon Peter therefore having a sword, drew it, and struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear; and the slave's name was Malchus.

<sup>11</sup> Jesus therefore said to Peter, "Put the sword into the sheath; the cup which the Father has given Me, shall I not drink it?"

<sup>12</sup> So the *Roman* cohort and the commander, and the officers of the Jews, arrested Jesus and bound Him,

**John 21:15** So when they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Tend My lambs."

<sup>16</sup> He said to him again a second time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Shepherd My sheep."

<sup>17</sup> He said to him the third time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep."

<sup>18</sup> "Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to gird yourself, and walk wherever you wished; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will gird you, and bring you where you do not wish to go."

<sup>19</sup> Now this He said, signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when He had spoken this, He said to him, "Follow Me!"

<sup>20</sup> Peter, turning around, saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following *them*; the one who also had leaned back on His breast at the supper, and said, "Lord, who is the one who betrays You?"

<sup>21</sup> Peter therefore seeing him said to Jesus, "Lord, and what about this man?"

<sup>22</sup> Jesus said to him, "If I want him to remain until I come, what *is that* to you? You follow Me!"

**Acts 2:21** '...everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

<sup>22</sup> "Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know--

<sup>23</sup> this *Man*, delivered up by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put *Him* to death.

<sup>24</sup> "And God raised Him up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power.

...<sup>37</sup> Now when they heard *this*, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?"

<sup>38</sup> And Peter *said* to them, "Repent, and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

<sup>39</sup> "For the promise is for you and your children, and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God shall call to Himself."

<sup>40</sup> And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on exhorting them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation!"

<sup>41</sup> So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

<sup>42</sup> And they were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

**Acts 4:7** And when they had placed them in the center, they *began to* inquire, "By what power, or in what name, have you done this?"

<sup>8</sup> Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers and elders of the people,

<sup>9</sup> if we are on trial today for a benefit done to a sick man, as to how this man has been made well,

<sup>10</sup> let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead-- by this *name* this man stands here before you in good health.

<sup>11</sup> "He is the stone which was rejected by you, the builders, *but* which became the very corner *stone*.

<sup>12</sup> "And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men, by which we must be saved."

<sup>13</sup> Now as they observed the confidence of Peter and John, and understood that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were marveling, and *began* to recognize them as having been with Jesus.

**Acts 5:40** And they took his advice; and after calling the apostles in, they flogged them and ordered them to speak no more in the name of Jesus, and *then* released them.

<sup>41</sup> So they went on their way from the presence of the Council, rejoicing that they had been considered worthy to suffer shame for *His* name.

<sup>42</sup> And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they kept right on teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ.

**Acts 11:1** Now the apostles and the brethren who were throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God.

<sup>2</sup> And when Peter came up to Jerusalem, those who were circumcised took issue with him,

<sup>3</sup> saying, "You went to uncircumcised men and ate with them."

<sup>4</sup> But Peter began *speaking* and *proceeded* to explain to them in orderly sequence, saying,

**Galatians 2:11** But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned.

<sup>12</sup> For prior to the coming of certain men from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, he *began* to withdraw and hold himself aloof, fearing the party of the circumcision.

<sup>13</sup> And the rest of the Jews joined him in hypocrisy, with the result that even Barnabas was carried away by their hypocrisy.

**Acts 12:1** Now about that time Herod the king laid hands on some who belonged to the church, in order to mistreat them.

<sup>2</sup> And he had James the brother of John put to death with a sword.

<sup>3</sup> And when he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. Now it was during the days of Unleavened Bread.

<sup>4</sup> And when he had seized him, he put him in prison, delivering him to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending after the Passover to bring him out before the people.

<sup>5</sup> So Peter was kept in the prison, but prayer for him was being made fervently by the church to God.

<sup>6</sup> And on the very night when Herod was about to bring him forward, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains; and guards in front of the door were watching over the prison.

**Acts 15:5** ...certain ones of the sect of the Pharisees who had believed, stood up, saying, "It is necessary to circumcise them, and to direct them to observe the Law of Moses."

<sup>6</sup> And the apostles and the elders came together to look into this matter.

<sup>7</sup> And after there had been much debate, Peter stood up and said to them, "Brethren, you know that in the early days God made a choice among you, that by my mouth the Gentiles should hear the word of the gospel and believe.

<sup>8</sup> "And God, who knows the heart, bore witness to them, giving them the Holy Spirit, just as He also did to us;

<sup>9</sup> and He made no distinction between us and them, cleansing their hearts by faith.

<sup>10</sup> "Now therefore why do you put God to the test by placing upon the neck of the disciples a yoke which neither our fathers nor we have been able to bear?

<sup>11</sup> "But we believe that we are saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, in the same way as they also are."

**Galatians 2:11** ...when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned.

<sup>12</sup> For prior to the coming of certain men from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, he *began* to withdraw and hold himself aloof, fearing the party of the circumcision.

<sup>13</sup> And the rest of the Jews joined him in hypocrisy, with the result that even Barnabas was carried away by their hypocrisy.

<sup>14</sup> But when I saw that they were not straightforward about the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas in the presence of all, "If you, being a Jew, live like the Gentiles and not like the Jews, how *is it that* you compel the Gentiles to live like Jews?"
