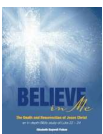

Life Groups are **designed to live Jesus' priorities**

in a biblically balanced way. Therefore, each group has

1. A facilitator and an assistant who are responsible for our 1st priority and general oversight of everything

2. A facilitator and an assistant who are responsible for our 2nd priority including keeping up with attendance, the needs of each member and fellowship events

3. A facilitator and an assistant who are responsible for our 3rd priority including helping the group plan periodic outreach events

Life Groups are **structured to train leaders**.

Making disciples produces numerical growth and the eventual need to birth a new group. This new group will need facilitators. Therefore, each facilitator must be mentoring at least one assistant to help them do their function and to lead in the formation of the new group. A group will probably experience a need to give birth to a new group after an ongoing regular attendance of more than 16ish. More members than 16 make it difficult for all members to participate in discussions and prayer.

Life Groups **practice biblical relationship values** including:

1. **All we say and do is for the glory of God**
2. **The Golden Rule** (The rule of Love, 1 Corinthians 13)
3. **Confidentiality**
4. **Emotional safety** No one is to be “put on the spot”
5. **Edification** “Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a *word* as is good for edification according to the need *of the moment*, that it may give grace to those who hear.” Ephesians 4:29
6. **Patience** Some may want a highly focused Bible study (a focus on our 1st priority) and others prefer a lot of discussion and sharing (a focus on our 2nd priority). We will try to appreciate the perspectives of both and hit a balance.
7. **Consideration of the weak and the lost**
8. **A biblically balanced pursuit of unity and purity** (a Romans 14 approach to doctrine)

Life Groups fulfill biblical small group instructions.

Acts 2:40 And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on exhorting them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation!"

⁴¹ So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

⁴² And they were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

⁴³ And everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles.

⁴⁴ And all those who had believed were together, and had all things in common;

⁴⁵ and they *began* selling their property and possessions, and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need.

⁴⁶ And day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart,

⁴⁷ praising God, and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved.

Ephesians 4:11 And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers,

¹² for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ;

¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fulness of Christ.

¹⁴ As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming;

¹⁵ but speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in all *aspects* into Him, who is the head, even Christ,

¹⁶ from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together by that which every joint supplies, according to the proper working of each individual part, causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love.

1 Peter 4:7 The end of all things is at hand; therefore, be of sound judgment and sober *spirit* for the purpose of prayer.

⁸ Above all, keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins.

⁹ Be hospitable to one another without complaint.

¹⁰ As each one has received a *special* gift, employ it in serving one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

Hebrews 10:24 and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds,
²⁵ not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging *one another*; and all the more, as you see the day drawing near.

Colossians 3:12 And so, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience;

¹³ bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you.

¹⁴ And beyond all these things *put on* love, which is the perfect bond of unity.

¹⁵ And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body; and be thankful.

¹⁶ Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms *and* hymns *and* spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

Our three relational settings

1. Corporate Worship

Corporate worship is about **honoring God together**

through engaging, God-glorifying music, and relevant, expository teaching.

This experience involves

- **exalting God together** with deep reverence and joyful celebration
- **growing in the knowledge of God** verse-by-verse
- **applying God's word** to every aspect of family, work, recreation, and real life

2. Life Groups

Life Groups are about **doing life together**

through living in community, helping each other with life's challenges and experiencing mutual discipleship in small groups.

This experience involves growing together in Jesus' priorities:

- **loving God** through prayer and mutual discipleship in the study and application of His word
- **loving each other** through sharing joys and challenges together with mutual ministry and prayer
- **making disciples** through loving, serving, and sharing the good news with our neighbors and praying for them.

3. Ministry Teams

Ministry teams are about **serving others together**

through using the gifts, abilities, and opportunities Jesus has given to each of us.

Each ministry team focuses on one of Jesus' three priorities or the support of these priorities:

Teams focused on inspiring our love for God

- **Music team** - vocalists, instrumentalists, audio and visual techs
- **Student discipleship team** - student Life Groups, nursery, Children's Church, Kids Clubs, and youth ministries
- **Adult discipleship team** - (in addition to Life Groups) prayer groups, women's groups, men's groups, classes, seminars, individual discipleship, and leadership training

Teams focused on inspiring our love for one another

- **Hospitality team** - greeters, connection table, coffee bar, meals, events, safety
- **Member services** - meals, transportation, home maintenance and visitation
- **Persecuted church team** - educates, inspires, and guides the church in the most efficient and effective ways we can help our persecuted church family around the world

Teams focused on making disciples

- **Outreach team** - sets the example, educates, inspires and equips the church to love, serve and share the gospel in our community and disciple those who place their trust in Jesus.
- **North American missions team** - educates, inspires and guides the church in supporting disciple-making and church planting in North America.
- **International missions team** - educates, inspires and guides the church in supporting disciple-making and church planting among every people-group beyond North America.

Support teams

- **Administration team** - supports all the teams by helping them and the church with resources, communication, accounting, budgetary wisdom, and coordination with other ministry teams.
- **Stewardship team** – educates, inspires, and supplies counsel to the church regarding biblical stewardship, budgeting and accounting.
- **Facilities team** - help maintain the physical property of the church
- **Deacons** - Christ-like servants who set the example for the rest of the church by helping meet the needs of the church family
- **Elders** - Christ-like servants who pray for, teach, lead, oversee, protect and serve the church.
