Hebrews 2:1 For this reason we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it.

²For if the word spoken through angels proved unalterable, and every transgression and disobedience received a just penalty,

³how will we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? After it was at the first spoken through the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who heard,

⁴God also testifying with them, both by signs and wonders and by various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit according to His own will.

Hebrews 3:12 Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart that falls away from the living God.

¹³But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called “Today,” so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin.

¹⁴For we have become partakers of Christ, if we hold fast the beginning of our assurance firm until the end,

¹⁵while it is said, “Today if you hear His voice,

Do not harden your hearts, as when they provoked Me.”

¹⁶For who provoked Him when they had heard? Indeed, did not all those who came out of Egypt led by Moses?

Hebrews 5:11 Concerning him (*Jesus*) we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing.

¹²For though by this time you ought to be **teachers**, you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God, and you have come to need milk and not **solid food**.

¹³For everyone who partakes only of milk is not **accustomed to the word of righteousness**, for he is an infant.

¹⁴But solid food is for the **mature**, who because of practice have their senses **trained to discern good and evil**.

6:1 ¹Therefore leaving the elementary teaching about the Christ,
let us press on to maturity, not laying again a foundation

of repentance from dead works
and of faith toward God,

²of instruction about washings
and laying on of hands,
and the resurrection of the dead
and eternal judgment.

³And this we will do, if God permits.

⁴For in the case of those who have
once been enlightened
and have tasted of the heavenly gift
and have been made partakers of the Holy Spirit,

⁵and have tasted the good word of God
and the powers of the age to come,

⁶and then have fallen away,
it is impossible to renew them again to repentance,
since they again crucify to themselves the Son of God
and put Him to open shame.

⁷For ground that drinks the rain which often falls on it and brings forth vegetation
useful to those for whose sake it is also tilled, receives a blessing from God;

⁸but if it yields thorns and thistles, it is worthless and close to being cursed,
and it ends up being burned.

⁹But, beloved, we are convinced of better things concerning you,
and things that accompany salvation, though we are speaking in this way.

¹⁰For God is not unjust so as to forget your work and the love which you have
shown toward His name, in having ministered and in still ministering to the saints.

¹¹And we desire that each one of you show the same diligence
so as to realize the full assurance of hope until the end,

¹²so that you will not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and
patience inherit the promises.

¹³For when God made the promise to Abraham, since He could swear by no one
greater, He swore by Himself,

¹⁴saying, "I will surely bless you and I will surely multiply you."

¹⁵And so, having patiently waited, he obtained the promise.

¹⁶For men swear by one greater than themselves, and with them an oath given
as confirmation is an end of every dispute.

¹⁷In the same way God, desiring even more to show to the heirs of the promise
the unchangeableness of His purpose, interposed with an oath,

¹⁸so that by two unchangeable things in which it is impossible for God to lie, we
who have taken refuge would have strong encouragement to take hold of the
hope set before us.

¹⁹This hope we have as

an anchor of the soul,

a hope both sure and steadfast and one which enters within the veil,

²⁰where Jesus has entered as a forerunner for us,

having become a high priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.

Hebrews 10:19 Therefore, brethren, since we have confidence to enter the holy place by the blood of Jesus,

²⁰by a new and living way which He inaugurated for us through the veil, that is, His flesh,

²¹and since we have a great priest over the house of God,

²²let us draw near with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

²³Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful;

²⁴and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds,

²⁵not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near.

²⁶For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins,

²⁷but a terrifying expectation of judgment and the fury of a fire which will consume the adversaries.

²⁸Anyone who has set aside the Law of Moses dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses.

²⁹How much severer punishment do you think he will deserve who

has trampled under foot the Son of God,

and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified,

and has insulted the Spirit of grace?

³⁰For we know Him who said, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay."

And again, "The Lord will judge His people."

³¹It is a terrifying thing to fall into the hands of the living God.
